St. Charles Sportsman's Club, Inc. Annual Membership Meeting Minutes Wednesday May 5, 2010

The meeting was called to order by President Frank Fruh at 8 p.m. Scouts of Troop 424 lead the membership in the Pledge of Allegiance. Steve Allen offered the invocation. Scout of Troop 424 offered their heartfelt apology for missing our annual meeting. Board members present were Frank Fruh, Marlene Smith, Jose Torres, Paul Goodwin, James Pollock, John Fitch, Phil Lang, Dave George, and Brian Malpasso. Absent were Elaine Costello and Tony Barnett. Forty-one members and guests signed the roster.

President: A motion was offered to accept the April 7, 2010 membership minutes as printed in the *Recoil*. The motion was seconded and passed.

President Fruh stated that Middleton Hall is doing well, this is their busy season. He then read a thank you note from Janet Moss for the fruit basket we sent as she recovered from eye surgery. He referred members to his President's Column in the latest issue of the *Recoil*. He stated that he met with Mark McFarland to discuss the new lease which he should have by this Friday. He got clarification at that meeting about lead cleanup and reclamation on the current range. These two issues are top priority for him.

First Vice President: Marlene Smith reported that St. Charles Sportsman's Club is sponsoring the Refuse To Be A Victim program on May 22. She has been in contact with the county commissioners and Sheriff Rex Coffey. Today she received a call from Dr. Edith Patterson, First Vice President of the county commissioners. They talked about 40 minutes about the program. Dr. Patterson shot at our indoor range and reaffirmed her good impression of our range, hunter safety, junior rifle, boy scouts, 4-H and community involvement. Dr. Patterson stated

she would offer a proclamation to make May 22, 2010, Refuse To Be A Victim Day in the county. Charles County will post the proclamation on their web site and will present the proclamation on Saturday, May 22 during our program. As a club we should be extremely proud of this. It gets our name before the public. The program is also on the NRA website. Registration forms are available for the program. Call if you have any questions.

Second Vice President: Jose Torres introduced the new chairman for the Indoor Range Committee, Sharon Griffiths. Randall Browning will be her co-chair. Chairman Griffiths reported that the multi disciplinary target challenge has just finished. First place was won by Ron Fry with a perfect score of 500. Ben Miller was second and Justin Keeting was third. We are starting a new .22 league before the end of the month. Tuesday next week will be ladies night. Randal Browning reported that Al Horn has requested to use the range on Wednesday night for Venture Quest, a boy scout event. He has 8-10 kids ages 14 to 17. The indoor range will be opened that night so we don't need a range closure. He will provide RSO's to assist. He will only use four lanes. He will provide proof of insurance and the kid's parents will sign waivers.

Jose Torres reported Ron Fry, LaPlata High School Junior ROTC, has volunteered to conduct two air rifle clinics in June for area ROTC students and 4-H students. The clinics will be from June 23 to 26 and June 30 to July 2. Future clinics will depend on the success of these. He then reported that Fernando Anzola was involved in a serious car accident and is recovering in Prince Georges Hospital. Please remember him in your prayers.

Publicity: Paul Goodwin reported we are not just a gun club, we are a sportsman's club and we do fish. We could get a charter fishing trip together if anyone is interested. We will get publicity in the Maryland Independent for our air rifle and Refuse to be a Victim programs. If you have anything you want in the paper, let him know.

Huntsmaster: Jim Pollock presented awards to Neil Bayley for his harvest during the last hunting season. He reminded members that it is turkey season and to be very careful where you shoot. This is the most dangerous time in the woods. Look closely if you hear a gobbler, it may be another hunter. Be sure of your target.

Ways and Means: John Fitch had 50/50 tickets for sale and shirts and hats. He reported that several years ago half of the 50/50 raffle went to the member and half to the club. It evolved somehow that the club's 50 percent went to the workers. We'd like to change it to 50 percent for the club, 25 percent for the winner of the raffle, and 25 percent to the worker. He will make a motion under new business.

Property: Dave George reported the property report is on the web site.

Wildlife: Brian Malpasso reported there is a crawfish ban in effect for the upper Potomac, Middle Potomac and Susquehanna Rivers. You cannot catch or possess crawfish since last October. He reminded members that 2010 recreational anglers need to sign up with the National Saltwater Anglers registry through the DNR website. The blue crab population is at its highest level since 1997. Stripped bass and summer flounder season opened April 17 and runs through November 22. You are allowed three fish at 19 inches long minimum.

Committee Reports:

Grounds: Randal Browning reported the red truck does not start so needs to be worked on. President Fruh will contact Roger Hall to fix the truck.

Hunter Safety: Dates for the classes are printed in the Recoil.

IPSC: Andy White reported last month there were 49 shooters. This month's match is Sunday in conjunction with Charles County Sheriff's pistol match. He reported there was no range closure listed on the *Recoil* calendar for Friday for match setup. The Sunday match starts at 8:30 if you want to shoot.

Junior Rifle: Perrin Lewis reported that the matches are the first Sunday of each month. We had six shooters last month. This is a good time for members to complete their required work hours. The junior rifle matches will remain in the indoor range starting at 1 o'clock. Give him a call if you have kids who are interested.

Membership: Dave George reported there are 25 members who have not paid their dues, 15 or so have resigned, and letters have been sent to several associate members offering them an upgrade to regular membership. Additional letters will be sent in the next few weeks. There were four applicants for membership: L. Todd Fuss sponsored by Perrin Lewis; John Stratton Jr. sponsored by Andy White. Charles Boenig and Nicholas Kunysz sponsored by Jon Harris who did not renew his membership. Dave George offered to sponsor these gentlemen as did Brian Malpasso. The perspective members were asked to leave the room and a motion was made to accept them into membership. The motion was seconded. A member mentioned that Jon Harris has been sponsoring applicants that he doesn't know. If he renews his membership, he needs to be spoken to about this practice. Another member confirmed this. The vote to accept the prospective members was called and the motion passed. The new members were welcomed into the club.

Mountain Property: Jim Pollock reported he is planning a trip to the property to sow seed on the excavated ground to reduce erosion. Help is needed and anyone who wants to see the property is invited to join the work party. Any person who wishes to go should call Jim at 301-843-6240. Please leave your name and phone number.

Range Closure: Charlie Embody reported work is continuing. ACPT is redoing their scope of work regarding metal reclamation and we should have this document within a week. We will solicit bids once we get it. The range will be closing by the end of this summer. However, this is not public information due to legal ramifications and regulations associated with closing the range. We have good companies interested in offering bids for cleaning up the hot spots and it will cost us a few dollars. A member advised the membership that the correct terminology for what we are doing on the outdoor range is a metal reclamation project. It is important to distinguish the two. What we are doing is a green thing, it's good for the environment.

Range Development: Phil Lang reported he is awaiting the new lease before work will begin on the new property.

Shotgun: Frank Fruh reported shotgun took in \$413. Shotgun will be closed for the Glock match and Mother's Day. Work is being done on the skeet trigger release. Only trap will be available on the third Sunday of each month until the IPSC match is completed.

Silhouette: Brian Rehm reported the first match had 29 shooters. It was a good turnout. Cowboy lever action events have brought out more shooters. Our next match is the 4th Sunday in June.

Unfinished Business: None

New Business: John Fitch made a motion to change the 50/50 raffle to 50 percent for the club, 25 percent for the raffle winner, and 25 percent for the worker. The motion was seconded. A vote was called by a show of hands and the motion failed.

Charlie Embody reminded members that the Glock match will be held May 14-16. Workers please sign up. He made a motion for \$300 to purchase food for the Glock match. After a second, the motion passed.

Frank Fruh reminded members to sign the roster and sign up for the mountain property work party.

Good and Welfare: Perrin Lewis offered raffle tickets for a Thompson version semi-automatic with violin case.

FREE FOR SCSC MEMBERS: You do not have to pay the entry fee the first time you participate in a Sporting Rifle match. How can you refuse that offer?

FREE TRAINING AND COACHING FOR BEGINNERS: I will be available after the completion of competition on match day for an hour or so to provide help with your shooting. Please check in while the last match is in progress. Bring your equipment.

NEXT MATCH DAYS are June 6th and July 4th.

TOURNAMENT RESULTS: The May High Power Match was won by **Woody De Swarte.** Second place went to **Steve Haimbach** and **Larry Cox** captured third place. The Sporting

Rifle match was won by **John Leber**. Second place went to **Woody De Swarte**. Many of the regular shooters did not attend these matches because they were participating in the clinic at Marine Corps Base, Quantico.

SHOOTING TIP: Practice often. The range is open most days.

BEGINNERS: To get started in high power competition at SCSC, your first step, assuming you already know how to operate and shoot your rifle safely in the required positions, is to participate in SPORTING RIFLE matches to gain experience, confidence and competence. The atmosphere is casual and fun. SPORTING RIFLE matches are unique because instruction and coaching will be allowed. NRA Sporting Rifle matches are held each month following the last relay of the High Power match No special equipment is required for SPORTING RIFLE matches; your center fire deer hunting rifle or WWII rifle will suffice. Bring 34 -40 cartridges and you will be good to go. Even though the target is a whooping 18.35 inches in diameter you should know your rifle's zero for 100 yards. The course of fire for a Sporting Rifle Match (32 shots) follows. The only sighting in period will precede the first stage.

- Stage 1 8 shots for record from the PRONE position in a time of 8 minutes.
- Stage 2 8 shots in time limit of 8 minutes from the STANDING position.
- Stage 3 Two 4-shot strings in a time limit of 30 seconds for each string from the SITTING or KNEELING position.
- Stage 4 Two 4-shot strings in a time limit of 30 seconds for each string from the PRONE position.

Attention HUNTERS. Keep your marksmanship skills sharp by shooting in the Sporting Rifle matches held on the 1st Sunday of each month. Come join the fun.

RULES: While High Power matches are in progress, competitors, spectators and others inside the range complex, which includes the observation area, are subject to all NRA rules, NRA By-Laws and all SCSC rules. Coaching during a conventional Individual I High Power Rifle match is prohibited by NRA rules.

WAIVERS: Non-members have to have a SCSC Hold Harmless Waiver dated 2010 on file with the High Power Committee before they can compete in a match. **No exceptions.** Forms will be available on match days.

Fairfax Rod and Gun Club (Fairfax, VA) will be conducting High Power Rifle matches (200 yards) open to the public on June 19, July 17, August 21, September 18, October 23, November 20, December 18. Contact Alan Willard at 703-753-3431 or email arwillard@comcast.net for details. Cavalier Rifle and Pistol Club (www.cavrpc.org) conducts 200 yard conventional High Power Rifle matches on the 4th Saturday of each month.

Attention COWBOY ACTION Shooters: your lever action or pump action rifle is suitable for the Sporting Rifle matches held on the 1st Sunday of each month. Come join the fun.

High Power Rifle Match Director's Bulletin: The walk-in Registration Period begins at 7:15 am. The first relay begins when 10 shooters sign in or at 8 am; whichever occurs first. Subsequent relays begin approximately 10 minutes after the conclusion of the previous relay.

Sporting Rifle Match Director's Bulletin: The walk-in Registration Period begins at 7:30 am. The first relay will begin approximately 10-15 minutes after completion of the last relay of the conventional High Power Rifle tournament of the same day.

Etiquette Item: During a conventional High Power match, everyone in the rifle range complex is expected to limit conversation to official business while competitors are in the process of preparing for and shooting their strings.






